To the Sisters of Tau Beta Sigma,

Greetings in the bond of musical service. It is with great confidence that I submit my letter of intent to run for the position of National Vice President for Colonization and Membership for Tau Beta Sigma. Since 2017, it has been my pleasure to serve as your National Vice President for Special Projects. This biennium, my role as the NVPSP has been both rewarding and challenging in unexpected ways, but it is through these challenges that I believe I have been suitably prepared for elevation to this developmental role on the National Council of Tau Beta Sigma.

Upon being elected as the NVPSP, I worked to identify and execute the fundamental responsibilities of the role. This included continuing the task of managing the *Focus On Five Campaign*, confirming each of the *Women In Music Speakers* for the District Conventions, updating content on the *4Gr8rBands YouTube Channel* and working alongside our National Vice President for Communication and Recognition to implement daily activities during Tau Beta Sigma's 13 Days of TBS. Some of the key points of success in working on these projects have included being able to get out in front of confirming all *Women In Music Speakers* before the end of each Fall Semester, educating and assisting chapters on selecting worthwhile projects as a part of the *Focus On Five Campaign*, updating and consolidating each of our TBS National Program Guides into one document, co-authoring the National Intercollegiate Band Audition Event Program Guide and collaboratively creating the TBS Risk Management Education Video. Along with executing these fundamental duties, I was also charged with continuing work on the *For Greater Practice Initiative*. In continuing this development, I was able to work with TBS Chapters of varying sizes and gather feedback on the prescribed practice software, while working to establish the best practices in executing an initiative of this nature.

Beyond the day to day operations of serving as the TBS National VPSP, there have been a few moments this biennium that have afforded me the opportunity to cultivate some of the important skills that will be very useful should I be elected to the office of National Vice President for Colonization and Membership. This includes working one-on-one to help a chapter that was on the brink of folding due to low membership numbers, traveling to survey the college campus and band program of a potential colony, conducting an online paperwork study session for the Fall Activity Report, and occasionally being tasked with conducting chapter investigations.

If elected to the office of National Vice President for Colonization and Membership, I will work to faithfully execute the primary duties of the office. Along with this promise, I would also like to lay the foundation in which to continue sending exploratory teams to the campuses in which we receive colony applications and attend professional music conferences to network for the sorority. I would also like to focus on ways to ensure that each of our currently active chapters are proficient in their operations by working up-close with our Chapter Visitation Assistants and District Counselors as they visit your campuses. As work will continue on the National Curriculum, it will be important to understand the challenges that chapters face and this is valuable information provided by the members of our National Leadership team that are boots on the ground within each district.

Another major focus I would like to take us back to this biennium, is ensuring that all chapters are implementing a culture of a Continuing Membership Education. Learning about our sorority goes far beyond the 4 – 8 weeks we spent as Membership Candidates. I know this, because in October 2019, I will be celebrating my 20th year as a member of this amazing sisterhood and I am constantly learning new things about us. It's the beauty of our ever growing, ever evolving organization and I would like to do my part to instill this mission of continuous growth to every single chapter of Tau Beta Sigma. I'd like to accomplish this by working with the District VPMs and allowing them to work together to create the best practices for executing a Continuing Membership Education. The challenge is great, but the chance to work with students and see them excel is greater.

As we begin the celebrations leading up to our 75th Anniversary, I am excited about the chance to continue my service to the sorority and I hope I have instilled in you a sense of confidence in knowing that my vast experience and dedication to the ideals of the sorority are what make me a worthy candidate for this position. I thank you in advance for your consideration in my pursuit to be the next Vice President for Colonization and Membership of Tau Beta Sigma.
